**Holiday Workshops in Robotics, Reading, Aviation and Museum visit**

Holiday workshops for 30 children from very impoverished areas around Cape Town. The workshop is for 3 days from 1 to 4pm and run every school holiday. The children do Robotics, have Reading activities on iPads, enjoy a Museum visit and a show at the Planetarium.

We provide a nutritious snack on each day, transport to and from the Cape Town Museum and tickets to the Planetarium. The workshop is facilitated by our professional and volunteer team of at least 6 adults.

**Holiday Workshop Funding Options for 30 children:**

- R500 per child per workshop
- R15 000 per holiday workshop for 30 children



## *Every teacher is a language teacher* Short course for Grade 4-7 teachers

### Problem statement

ORT SA CAPE's work in teacher development and education research in recent years has identified inadequate language development among young learners as a major constraint to education achievement in all subjects, including mathematics, particularly in schools serving disadvantaged communities.

A major area for concern which has largely been neglected, is the fact that Intermediate and Senior Phase teachers' initial training has traditionally not prepared them to teach basic reading skills. The assumption is that learners can read by the time they enter Grade 4, but this is often not the case. Several recent studies have shown that more than three quarters of learners in South Africa - particularly in schools serving poor communities, lag two or three grades behind their international peers in terms of reading levels. In practice, many teachers are therefore required to assist learners who struggle to read, but they are not equipped for the task.

### Aim of the course

ORT SA CAPE has developed the accredited short course<sup>1</sup>, *Every teacher is a language teacher*, in response to the above-mentioned problem. The course is designed to train and support Grade 4-7 teachers to teach reading with emphasis on remediation and interventions to assist learners who experience barriers to reading with comprehension. A significant bridging component between Grade 3 and Grade 4 is included. The focus is on 'teaching learners to read' at the level required for their current grade and to lay the foundation for 'reading to learn' in other subjects and throughout their school career.

Since February 2017, ORT SA CAPE, has presented the course to over 200 teachers, mainly from schools in disadvantaged communities. With further funding, we would be in a position to reach more teachers and in turn equip more learners with these vital skills.
