## 1.3 Key project goals

Reconnect the stunted vulnerable fatherless children with out of focus in class to receiving nutrition items, healthcare services, lasting access to talents detection and career development to boost their wellbeing and cognitive forward to quality education and overcome the setbacks of the father's roles missed and malnutrition.

Detecting their vision by general children protection from malnutrition, stunted, weak cognitive as forwarded early death, early school dropout and unproductive. We will protect them through on the provision of the core package of essential nutrition items, health services, talent detection and career development forward to wellbeing, quality education and resilience to creative industries.

Ensure a core package of essential nutrition items and health services to the most Helpless and vulnerable pregnant teenager and women: inclusive have access to Isibo business growth.

## Section 2. Project description

### 2.1 Rationale/justification/ background

Between November 2021 and January 2022, VMVP Members, led by Anathole Dusengumuremyi, organized several multi-sectoral assessment missions in Ngoma District to identify the critical needs of vulnerable children with malnutrition living on separated families and families with conflicts. Unfortunately, we went so deep to discover un-tackled setbacks and unreached categories of children: it is one and only vulnerable fatherless children with malnutrition not only such children lives with extremely poor grandmoms.

VMVP team has considered to the national policies but the general statement is anti-malnutrition because good health of citizens is a concern stone of great nation

VMVP team has considered the national institute of statistics of Rwanda but the general statement is indicating that Eastern province faced malnutrition and stint issues at the high level.

Assessments were conducted, through several focus groups discussions, key informant interviews, and informal conversations with Ngoma's women, men, girls, and boys. The findings of these assessment missions were focused into a need of vulnerable children but more prioritized on vulnerable fatherless children that live with extremely poor grandmoms.

Additionally, the VMVP team held numerous discussions with local authorities, NGOs, teachers, and heads of schools. The status of the health with nutrition and quality education of vulnerable children lives in poor and conflict families and vulnerable fatherless who is stunted and malnutrition not only they live with poor old grandmothers has been assessed as precarious, weak cognitive, out of focus in class, early school dropout, unprotected and ignored children, hung up with suicide ideology, candidates of unskilled labor-forces, candidates of criminal groups in future, unfortunately they struggle with limited health service, school materials, parenting, having fun over the past year.

Furthermore, structured nutrition, education, parenting, children's rights for all services were lacking for most of 2021. Health services are currently provided through Gikuriro kuri bese, isoko y'ubuzima and community post health care. The leading causes of morbidity are respiratory infections, dermatological, gastrointestinal conditions, nutrition, and clean water.

Unfortunately, vulnerable fatherless children are not being supported, there is a high burden of childhood rights for vulnerable fatherless children

Connect vulnerable fatherless who are stunted and malnutrition to basic needs as a whole but first and foremost the primarily rapid should be healthcare with nutrition, empowering their cognitive, rights for quality education, and having fun with them.

VMVP has a system for referral for general vulnerable malnutrition children but more deep on stunted vulnerable fatherless kids and early school dropout cases. interventions are being put in place to enable beneficiaries to access nutrition, healthcare, quality education, sports, saving accounts, talents detection, and career development services. Isibo business growth and community incubation for community members especially vulnerable youth out of school, teenage Mothers, widows, and fatherless youth.

The health and nutrition response will focus on the provision of the maximum package of essential nutrition items and health Services for general vulnerable malnutrition children but more deeply on vulnerable fatherless kids who are stunted, malnutrition, and weak cognitive. The quality education for all and having fun response will focus on the provision of the maximum package of essential education materials off-line, journaling, creativity class, mental therapy demo day, and sports kits for our beneficiaries.

The project will seek to ensure that all mentioned packages will be well delivered to each beneficiary to free them.

Examine is done by Anathole Dusengumuremyi the mastermind of Voice in Millions of Voiceless People (VMVP)

Indicated that 80% of the early child school dropout are vulnerable fatherless who are stunted, malnutrition and social abused not only lack of family provision at all. they're raised from a helpless


vulnerable woman during pregnancy, prisoner's families, fatherless homes, family conflict, and vulnerable grandmoms.

91% of children who are stunted, malnutrition and out of focus in class. the findings show their raised by a helpless vulnerable woman during pregnancy, Mathers are poor teen mothers who don't know where to finds the father, pohave or separated families, rejected poor mothers.

## 2.4. Expected results

1. Outcome: beneficiaries of concern have access to nutrition items and sustainable indirect health care.

Nutrition and health programme aims at minimizing morbidity, weak cognitive, stunt, child health protection and wellbeing of children of the eastern province. The activities to be delivered are comprehensive primary nutrition items and indirect health care services including inner therapy, mental health and psychosocial support. The services will be provided through primary nutrition and indirect healthcare to be provided shall include: Primary nutrition: carbohydrates, lipids, proteins, water, vitamins, and minerals.: items will be bananas, milk, clean water, eggs and tamarillos.

- a. Eggs raise good cholesterol. Eating eggs leads to elevated levels of high-density lipoprotein (HDL), also known as the "good" cholesterol. People who have higher HDL levels have a lower risk of heart disease, stroke, and other health issues. Get some choline. Choline is a water-soluble vitamin that is often grouped with the B vitamins. It's used to build cell membranes and helps produce signaling molecules in the brain. One hard-boiled egg has

about 147 milligrams of choline, which is 27% of the daily value recommended by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

- b. Egg yolks contain large amounts of lutein and zeaxanthin, helpful antioxidants that help reduce the risk of cataracts and macular degeneration in the eyes. Eggs are also high in vitamin A, which is beneficial for eye health. Get enough proteins and amino acids: Getting enough protein in our diets is an important way of helping our body's health. Each egg contains about six grams of protein, as well as helpful amino acids. Getting our share of protein for the day can help with weight management, increase muscle mass, lower blood pressure, and help our bones, as well.
- c. It's a nutritious treat. Though relatively small in size, eggs pack a lot of nutrition and can be an important staple in a well-balanced diet. One large boiled egg has about 77 calories and contains: Vitamins A, B5, B12, D, E, K, B6, Folate, Phosphorus, Selenium, Calcium, Zinc, six grams of protein, five grams of healthy fats "Eggs are a good source of protein (both whites and yolk). They also contain heart-healthy and strong cognitive and health protection as a whole. says Kurt Hong, MD, an internal medicine specialist at Keck Medicine of USC and professor of clinical medicine at the Keck School of Medicine of USC.
- d. Bananas following nutritional values: 65 Kcal / 278 KJ, 1.0g Protein, 0.1g Fat, 16.2g Carbohydrate, 1.1g fiber, and 264mg Potassium. Are an energy booster: Since they have a low water content, bananas typically have more calories as well as a higher sugar content compared to other fruits. They contain sugar in the form of sucrose, fructose, and glucose in combination with fibre, this allows them to supply an instant yet sustained boost of energy. As such bananas make a valuable inclusion both before and during a prolonged form of intensive exercise.
- e. Tamarillos following nutritional values: Biotin 1 µg, Carbohydrates 8 g, Chloride 8 mg, Copper 03 mg, Dietary fiber 3 g, Folate 4 g, Energy 31 Kcal, Iron 57 mg, Magnesium 6 mg, Manganese 114 µg, Niacin 271 mg, Pantothenate 04 mg, Protein 99 g, Potassium 321mg, Riboflavin 024 mg, Selenium 1 µg, Sulphur 2 mg, Thiamin 043 mg, Vitamin A 189 µg, Vitamin B6 198 mg, Vitamin C 8 mg, Vitamin E 94 mg, and Zinc 1 mg. Prevent Diabetes:
- f. The high content of fiber found in tamarillo can help maintain sugar levels in your bloodstream. The fruit contains a low glycaemic index hence consuming it does not increase your sugar level. It Boosts Metabolism: the metabolism functions to provide energy to the body. Nutritionists also stated that a boosted metabolism could help reduce excess body weight.

- g. Nutritional Value of Milk: According to the National Dairy Council, milk also contains nine essential nutrients: calcium, protein, potassium, phosphorus, riboflavin, niacin, and vitamin A, D, and B12. Nutritional value of 1 cup of whole milk: Water – 215.04 g, Energy – 149 kcal, Protein – 7.69 g, Total lipid – 7.93 g, Carbohydrate – 11.71 g, Sugars, total – 12.32 g, Calcium, Ca – 276 mg, Iron, Fe – 0.07 mg, Magnesium, Mg – 24 mg, Phosphorus, P – 205 mg, Potassium, K – 322 mg, Sodium, Na – 105 mg, Zinc, Zn – 0.90 mg, Riboflavin – 0.412 mg, Niacin – 0.217 mg, Folate – 12 mcg, Vitamin B-12 – 1.10 mcg, Vitamin A – 112 mcg and Vitamin D – 3.2 mcg.
- h. Curative Care: Outpatient services including integrated management of childhood illnesses, management of common non-communicable diseases and oral rehydration corner; inpatient services.
- i. Mental health and psychosocial support through community-based approaches including identification and referral of mental health cases, strengthening community support structures, provision of psychological first aid and counselling services and access to management of common mental disorders according to VMVP training protocols.
- j. Community health and nutrition: including community-based health and nutrition surveillance, health and nutrition education, referral and follow up
- k. Health facility-based nutrition services: Nutrition screening to identify children and pregnant and lactating women suffering from acute malnutrition/ not enrolled in the blanket supplementary feeding program and prompt referrals to the respective nutrition Programme; nutrition education
- l. Information management: monthly reporting includes pictures and video
- m. Medical warehousing: Health partners will ensure appropriate warehousing, distribution of medicines and medical supplies, with monitoring systems in place
- n. Nutrition items warehouse: VMVP team will ensure all are well managed and distribution of milk, eggs, bananas, clean waters, tamarillos,
- o. Talent incubation and career development: VMVP team will support those beneficiaries to grow and become productive human resources and development by conducting creative classes and playing games with them.

2.Outcome: Beneficiaries of concern have access to nutrition, healthcare and community nursing days services.



- a. The VMVP's nutrition and healthcare Programme aligns with the national policy on health strategy and aims to reduce the effects of childhood malnutrition and ensure that the nutrition wellbeing of the children is maintained.
- b. The services to be delivered are community management of acute malnutrition and prevention of malnutrition programmes such as infant and young child feeding (IYCF), blanket supplementary feeding programmes and micronutrient deficiency prevention and treatment and social behaviour change and communication (SBCC).
- c. Nutrition services will include integration of key health activities including assessing immunization status of children, assessment of attendance of pregnant and lactating women for antenatal and postnatal care and referral as relevant and other services. The nutrition services will be located within the community healthcare post and schools and the following activities implemented: Treatment of acute malnutrition
- d. Community nutrition screening to identify children suffering from acute malnutrition and prompt referrals to the respective nutrition programmes.
- e. Treat severe acute malnutrition in the outpatient therapeutic programmes. targeting children under 5 years and moderate acute malnutrition in the targeted supplementary feeding programmes under- 5 years and vulnerable pregnant teenagers and women and vulnerable lactating women.
- f. Community mobilization and nutrition education programmes to ensure sustained change, improved communication activities and utilization of tools to influence behaviour, knowledge and attitudes on nutrition, hygiene and social protection.
- g. Implement blanket supplementary feeding targeting all vulnerable children, months, pregnant and lactating women.
- h. Implement key community management of un-risk vulnerable, children, mothers pregnant, by using community-based mother to mother support groups.

3. Outcome: beneficiaries of concern have access to quality education, talent detection and career developments services.

- a. Quality education, talent detection, and career developments Programme aim at minimizing poor education, unproductive, unused skills, hopelessness, suicide ideology, weak cognitive, early child school dropout, anger, senseless, and vulnerable mindset.
- b. The activities to be delivered are comprehensive primary creative, talents incubation, financial education, savings accounts, journaling, demo day, services including playing.

- c. Talents incubation response will focus on the provision of the human resource capital. Product development, use of talents, dream come to life, productivity and strengthen child self-esteem.
- d. Journaling and demo day, response will focus on the provision of the resilience of knowledge, mental development, power planning and management.
- e. The talents detection and career development response will focus on the provision of the maximum package of inner healing, talent incubation, mentorships, and strengthening self-esteem and trips to meet a sense of more worth and refresh.
- f. Isibo business growth and community incubation response will focus on the provision of the maximum package sexual and finance, peacebuilding and social-economic development, children rights and product development, happy family and small businesses, poverty, and work. all those will happen at Isibo community level. The mission is to raise up and enable vulnerable youth out of school, teenage Mathers, widows, and fatherless youth to become sustainable growers and providers from unplanned family and poverty caves.
